

CHICHESTER AREA TALKING NEWS - "Hello ABC, Chriss and Chris Mustchin (Guide dog Kenny's Mum and Dad) are committee members of Chichester Area Talking News, (CATN) who provide audio recordings of articles and news from the Observer Series of local newspapers and put them onto a CD or memory stick enabling people to keep in touch with local news and events.

We have a recording studio in the grounds of St Richards Hospital, Chichester, from where every two weeks a team of volunteers provide this service and send out to over 400 visually impaired members of our community. The criteria for receiving this is that through sight loss, you cannot read the newspaper. We also offer this service to those who just cannot hold up a newspaper.

SAT7 ENCOURAGEMENTS - In a time of demonstrations and violence in Iraq and Iran, SAT7 is able to keep on providing Christian support to individuals and to help Iranians realize it is not unlawful for people to change from Islam to Christianity. The closure of churches in Algeria has given SAT7 the opportunity to speak to more people about the church and Jesus. Viewers' testimonies bring encouragement, too. Demonstrations in Lebanon have brought together various religious communities and SAT7 is inspiring children to dream of a brighter future. Partnership executive Dave Mann networks with our MPs from all 3 main parties and last year gave SAT7's first Middle East briefing, the government now formulating a response to the Algerian Government about church closures.
