The Glory of Zion (Isaiah 60:1-4, NIV)

'Arise, shine, for your light has come,
and the glory of the Lord rises upon you.

² See, darkness covers the earth
and thick darkness is over the peoples,
but the Lord rises upon you
and his glory appears over you.

³ Nations will come to your light,
and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

As the coronavirus contains to spread across the world (*darkness will cover the earth*) and panic buying, driven by selfish people, is paralysing our supermarkets (*thick darkness is over the people*) it is good to know that God is still in control. Whatever goes on around us we can and should be celebrating our glorious rescue through our Redeemer, the Lord Jesus Christ. This is not changed by anything that the world throws at us.

Darkness is for lying down; **light** is for rising up. Darkness is for gloom and sleep; **light** is for shining. When the **light has come**, we must respond, and **arise, shine!**

A MESSAGE FROM SIMON – As you now know, on advice from the Baptist union and the Government, we have closed down all of our activities. This includes Nick's Ladies Craft Evening planned Thursday 26th March and our AGM on Thursday, April 23rd. As I said last week as coronavirus spreads and it is only wise to take some precautions. To put it simply, there are, in effect, three 'fs'. The first thing we need to remember is that we are a people of 1. faith and 2. not of fear. God is with us all of the time, and is able for us at any time. This does not mean that we will not catch the virus, but it does mean we have hope in the present, as well as eternally. May this be a witness to those unbelievers we know, who might be panicking about this.

But our third 'f' is that we should not be frivolous. We need to be very hygienic at all times. The best way to do this is wash your hands regularly with soap and hot water and to avoid physical contact wherever possible.

Even though it is difficult try to keep on eye on your neighbours, especially if they are elderly. It would be really helpful to give them a ring every few days to check they are alright.
