THE GOSPEL MESSAGE (John 3:13-21)

Simon's message today contains probably the most well-known verse in the Bible, John 3:16. "For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." But this verse is often taken out of context and, as always, context matters. In today's sermon Simon expands the passage to take in verses 13-21. There is stark warning in v18, that "...whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son." Most people who live in our locality fall into this category and are blissfully going about their lives thinking they will be alright because they are generally good people (by the earth's standards). Is the church guilty of sugar-coating God's word? This will be interesting and challenging – don't miss it. Derek
