### THE SPLENDOUR OF THE KING (Psalm 104:1-6)

In this sermon, I want to spend a few moments thinking about the splendour of God – the splendour of the King. In recent weeks we have looked at his power and strength, but today I want to focus on his beauty, majesty and greatness. The language in Psalm 104, as is typical of the psalms, is incredibly poetic and artistic, as it draws out the wonders of God.

Over many years, I have been stunned at the beauty of creation. From the sea here at Aldwick; to the flowers in the Cathedral garden, through to the vast universe that I image with my telescope. From the macro to the micro I see the creativity of God; I do not know how people cannot see the miracle of it all and not believe in the Lord! Simon.


