HIDDEN HEROES - MORDECAI (from the Book of Esther)

Last Wednesday we began our new series on Hidden Heroes of the Bible – those people of faith who are not the - often studied - “larger than life” characters, but humble followers of God who had a major influence on the world around them. Last Wednesday we considered a special lady, Miriam, who had a major influence on the life of Moses and the escape of the Children of Israel from Egypt and the journey to the Promised Land. Today we are considering another special person – this time a man named Mordecai who also made a significant impact on the story of the Jews. He was of course the cousin of Esther who famously became Queen of Persia and wife to Xerxes 1 (known as Xerxes the Great). But I find that Mordecai is the real “hidden hero” of the story. He once said to Queen Esther in Chapter 4:14 *“who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this”*. We shall see in this study that this phrase *“for such a time as this”* certainly applied to Mordecai himself. This service will include communion.
