### THE POWER OF THE GOSPEL - Romans 1:16-17

This Sunday, Simon will be talking to us about Romans 1v16-17, which, as we shall see, fits with the John 3v16 message that Simon brought to us just before he went away. And this is important because it enables us to appreciate how well the scriptures fit together. Now, here's a challenging question. Have you ever found it difficult to talk to others about your faith? Is it a taboo subject, even in your own family? If so, have you ever wondered why? Well in today's reading the Apostle Paul tells us not to be ashamed of the Gospel because it really is the power of God. Rather than being reticent to speak out, we should remember that it is the Gospel that reveals the secret of God's everlasting plan of salvation for lost people — and that applied to all of us at one time. The Gospel shows us both how righteous God is in His plan for us to be saved and also how we may be made fit for eternal life. It is only through trusting in Jesus Christ that our relationship with God is made right. Now isn't that worth sharing with your non-Christian friends, family and neighbours?

However, if possible, we would like you to join us on Sunday in prayer at around 10.20am before watching the service at 10.30am as normal. **LEADERSHIP TEAM MEETING** – At our last leadership team meeting we had a long discussion as to the practical difficulties in re-opening the church for worship **as we are all keen to do**. As a result, we will be setting out the church in a way that would meet some of the government's guidelines on keeping us all safe in these difficult times. The leadership team will then meet again to discuss possible next steps. One of the big stumbling blocks for us, however, is the government's advice on protecting people of 70 as outlined below.

- Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID-19, including people who are aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions.
- Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much
  as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise
  contact with others outside of their household.

At the moment, we feel that, as much as we want to, we cannot open whilst this guidance remains in place. This also applies to all other activities that are held in the church buildings.

Consequently, our message remains - "NOT YET ABC".

The Lord switched the mood in the hospital from one of depression and sorrow to one of joy and happiness."
