**ROD AND CAROLE** - Carole and Rod have both tested positive for COVID and are in isolation. Apparently, Rod had been asked to take the funeral of a man (John) on Hayling island. After returning home he discovered that John had COVID on his death certificate and that his wife Betty had just been tested positive for it and their daughter (Jill) was getting tested. Two or three days after getting back home Rod and Carole began to feel unwell and hence got a test and tested positive (the second time after their Romania dose). The problem is made more complex because Rod and Carol after their return from Hayling Island had seen various people, all of whom are now having to be tested for COVID. Rod and Carol are not as poorly as last time but would welcome prayer for John's family and theirs. Please pray for Rod and Carole as well as the families mentioned above.
