GIFT AID – Although generally there is no such thing as a free gift, the government's gift aid scheme gets pretty close. If you are a taxpayer, it means we can claim an extra 25p for every pound you give through your tithes and offerings. The scheme cost you nothing. You do have to make a Gift Aid declaration for the us to be able to claim. You do this by filling in a form which you can get from Peter Kaufman. In the last financial year, we were able to claim around £9000 – which is a significant amount!
