MAF IN SOUTH SUDAN - Many in South Sudan believe sickness is the result of a curse and visit witch doctors to have a curse lifted or to have one placed on an enemy. The pressure to consult witch doctors is huge. Pastor Santino gives pastoral care as part of a regular community health and evangelism project organised by MAF partner 'In Deed And Truth Ministries.' They (IDAT), and MAF with its many air shuttle services, have a mission to bring Christ's love to remote communities. Light dawns and the people give up their traditions, and churches are planted. One day, for instance, at the project 22 people accepted Jesus, including a chief, who told his family he won't be practising witchcraft again!
