We will be holding two "virtual services" each week which you will be able to access through the church website. Our current midweek theme is "Readying ourselves for resurrection day" and our first service went out last Wednesday.

HAZEL GOLDSMITH – Last Saturday Hazel went to be with the Lord. Hazel died about 10 minutes to nine with her two daughters besides her bed. Brian is at home, still suffering from his car accident earlier this week. Please pray for Brian and the family at this time. Please also praise God for Hazel's life and that she is now free from all her earthly limitations and is with the Lord. With regard to Hazel's funeral due to the present coronavirus we are likely to be having a simple ceremony around the graveside. Reynolds have suggested Monday 6th April at 14.00 hours. Numbers will be limited to between 10 & 20 placed 2 metres apart. It will be family only with a few exceptions. We may get it videoed for those who cannot attend. Pastor Simon will officiate. As you will know, we have been sending out prayer requests almost daily this week. So, for those who don't have email, we have been asked to pray for:

"For my niece Joanne, who is very anaemic & now suffering from painful gallstones. She has suffered from ME for many years. They aren't churchgoers but her parents were very grateful when I asked if they would like us to pray." Molly Hawkins.

"I wondered if I could ask the church to pray for my sister Ruth. She recently started working in the Christie Hospital in Manchester, a specialist in Cancer treatment. She has been assigned to the ward dealing with the Covid 19 cases and had a patient die this week. Ruth, although churched as a child, does not know Jesus as her Saviour. She is finding the work very emotional and is a front line worker. Please pray for her safety and for a revelation of God in her life." Anna Applin.

"We would really value prayer for our Sarah who is a local doctor and for her husband, Chris, and their daughter Miri. Everyone in the health service is currently under enormous pressure." Bev.

"Please pray for Shavali and Avinash as they are both working at St. Richards with Shavali on the coronavirus ward. Pray also for the protection of their children." Stuart.

"James, my nephew is heading up a Covid-19 ward in London as well as having overall responsibility for ED. He is absolutely shattered with continual long hours in harrowing situations. Please pray for that James' own health is not affected by the virus. Please also pray for all medical staff currently involved in this fight." Derek.

"Please pray for pain relief for Marie, for peace of mind and for the medical team to make the right decision at this difficult time for the NHS. Please also pray for more general healing for Marie." [Marie is waiting to see if she can have an operation to fit a shunt into her brain to avoid the build up of CSF (cerebrospinal fluid) in the cavities (ventricles) of the brain]. Derek
