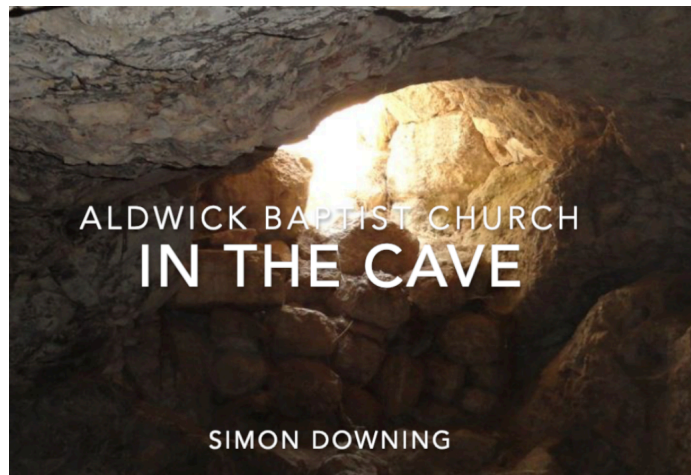

I could write so much more but for now, I pray that God, who 'knows when you sit or when you stand' would fill you with all peace as you fix your eyes on Him.
