ABC ONLINE - TWICE A WEEK - EVERY WEEK

Today, I believe the passage God has given me is, Romans 8v28-37. I am not going to go through every verse but draw out what I hope we need. One of the things that I was given as part of this, was a prophetic picture.

I saw a massive and vast jigsaw, with billions of pieces in it. Indeed, for every piece I could see, it was almost as though I could see down to the molecular level. All these pieces represented everything in our lives - everything. But as the pieces came together, the picture that formed was one of a giant hand – it was the hand of God! This meant that the hand of God was sovereignly over every tiny aspect of our lives, past, present and future. But as I looked more closely, the hand turned into the face of Jesus. I could not see his actual face, but I knew it was him. I believe God is telling us that this is his plan - that all that we go through, is to make us more like Jesus – to confirm us into the image of his Son – and all of it is under his sovereign hand.

However, if possible, we would like you to join us on Sunday in prayer at around 10.20am before watching the service at 10.30am as normal. Please pray for your church family and for all the frontline workers who are keeping us going in these difficult times. It is becoming clear that, as the lockdown continues, people will become more agitated, so, as we said last week, we need to keep our eyes firmly fixed on Jesus.
