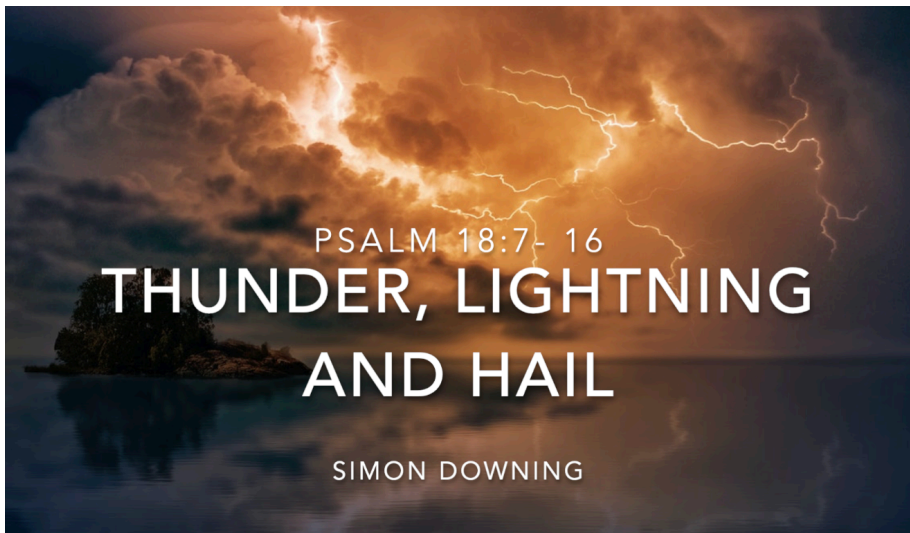

Thunder, lightning and hail

Today we will be looking at Psalm 18v7-16, the verses following those we looked at last week. I believe I have been given a prophetic picture too – which I shall detail at the end of my talk. For me, these are some of the most evocative descriptions of God in the bible. These verses describe a ‘theophany’. Theophany means ‘an appearance of God’, the word also means to shine, bring to light, to uncover, reveal and make known. So, these verses, then, are bringing to light, shining forth and making God known to us. This is God appearing to David – and he appears because of David’s cry about those cords of death, the cry that went into his, God’s, ears. So, this is God’s response to David.
