

The promised return should also inspire us to talk to any of our neighbours, friends and family who, as yet, don't recognise their sinfulness and their need of a Saviour. LEADERSHIP TEAM MEETING – At our last leadership team meeting we had a long discussion as to the practical difficulties in re-opening the church for worship **as we are all keen to do**. As a result, have now set out the church in a way that would meet some of the government's guidelines on keeping us all safe in these difficult times. The leadership team will then meet again to discuss possible next steps on the 8th September.

WHEN ARE WE GOING TO RE-OPEN? Following our next leadership team meeting we hope to publish the conditions that need to be meet for us to partial re-open for Sunday worship. As much as we would all like to return to normal and for us all to meet together, this will not be possible as social distancing restrictions must be maintained on the church premises which will include the car park. Numbers will have to be restricted and some sort of booking system put in place. The sanctuary will also look very different from normal. We will be including a photograph of what it will be like in a special bulletin to be published soon.

One of the big stumbling blocks for us, however, is the government's advice on protecting people of 70 as outlined below.

- Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID-19, including people who are aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions.
- Individuals who fall within this group are advised to stay at home as much as possible and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household.

At the moment, we feel that, **as much as we want to**, we cannot open whilst this guidance remains in place. Consequently, our message remains - "**NOT YET ABC**".

I first heard about Jesus when I joined the Boy's Brigade in 1951. We used to sing, "We have an anchor that keeps the soul steadfast and sure while the billows roll; fastened to a rock that cannot move, grounded firm and deep in the Saviour's love "Arthur
