

Perhaps God is trying to tell us something very specific at this difficult time. I also feel that God has given me a prophetic word directly related to the passage which I will be sharing with you. LEADERSHIP TEAM MEETING – At our last leadership team meeting on the 8th September, we had a long discussion as to the practical difficulties in re-opening the church for worship **as we are all keen to do**. As a result, have now set out the church in a way that would meet some of the government’s guidelines on keeping us all safe in these difficult times and ordered the necessary PPE equipment. We will shortly be sending you a document that will explain what the church will look like, what you can expect in the services and the necessary restrictions that will be in place to protect your safety. Of course, since that meeting, the government have introduced their rule of six and so we are now waiting for the detail of how that applies to church services to be published before we can go any further.

One of the big stumbling blocks for us, however, is the government’s advice on protecting people of 70 as outlined below.

- Certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID-19, including **people who are aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions**.
- Individuals who fall within this group are **advised to stay at home as much as possible** and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household.

At the moment, we feel that, **as much as we want to**, we cannot open whilst this guidance remains in place. Consequently, our message remains - “**NOT YET ABC**”.
