

SIGNS OF JESUS' RETURN 1 - GLOBAL ISSUES

This weekend Simon returns to our series on Jesus' return. Two weeks ago, in explaining the parable of the 10 virgins, Simon stressed the importance of being ready for Jesus' return. In today passage from Matthew 24:1-8, Jesus is teaching His disciples as they ask for a sign of His coming and the end of the age. Jesus' first response was "Watch out that no one deceives you." Jesus is emphasising that whenever we look for signs, we become susceptible to being deceived. As we have repeated over and over again, the only sure way to keep from being deceived is to focus on Jesus and His words. So please don't spend your time looking for special signs, and don't listen to idle speculation; instead look to Jesus and what He has to say. Derek

ON RE-OPENING THE CHURCH – We are re-opening the church on 11th October for our first limited worship service in church since March. By now, you should have all received a document and a video explaining what needs to happen to keep you all as safe as possible. You were also asked to fill out a personal risk assessment before you decide whether you should attend church.

We would strongly urge you to think very carefully about your decision especially if you are over 70 as the government's advice remains that certain groups of people may be at increased risk of severe disease from COVID-19, including **people who are aged 70 or older, regardless of medical conditions.** Individuals who fall within this group are **advised to stay at home as much as possible** and, if they do go out, to take particular care to minimise contact with others outside of their household.

Please confirm in writing or by email your decision or by phone as to whether you prefer to stay at home and worship as you have been doing for the past six months or whether you feel able to come to the service. Numbers will be restricted to around 35 and based on the your response we will then issue invitations to attend. Please understand that you cannot attend without a confirmed reservation as we have to follow 'Track and Trace' procedures. This process will be repeated on each subsequent weekend unless conditions change. You can change your weekly status by simply contacting me at any time. You must observe social distancing and wear a mask within the church boundaries at all times. If you are unsure as to how this will work and how it affects you, please give me a ring. Derek
