ON RE-OPENING THE CHURCH – As you know we are re-opening the church today (11th October) for our first limited worship service in church since March. It won’t be church as we know it or how we want it to be – but it does comply with the government’s current advice. If all goes well, and there isn’t a change in the government’s advice to churches, we now be open every Sunday morning. By now, you should have told me whether you want to continue to worship home (Status - HOME) or whether you want to attend the live service (Status – CHURCH). You are free to change your mind at any time by letting me know in writing as we have to keep detailed records of who attends for “Track and Trace” purposes. We do need to know by Monday evening of any changes. This might mean that we cannot accommodate everyone who wants to come every week and we may have to use a rota system. When on the church property (and that includes the car park), you must observe social distancing and wear a mask within the church boundaries at all times. Some of you haven’t yet put your choice in writing and so, if that is you, can you do so as soon as possible. If you are unsure as to how this will work and how it affects you, please give me a ring. MISSION UPDATE 1 - MAF. Arnhem Land is north-western Australia is a vast area of largely indigenous Australians. They are 35 times more likely to be victims of domestic violence than their white counterparts. MAF is developing a strong partnership with a network of women’s shelters. Women have been helped into employment and children have received an education. MAF flies passengers to escape to safety in under 60 minute in contrast to what could be a rough 12 hours and that only in the dry season.
