## ABC ONLINE – TWICE A WEEK – EVERY WEEK

This weekend we will be worshipping both in church and online. As you are aware, due to social distancing recommendations, numbers in church are restricted to 34. Of course, our online services will be continuing as normal. This week the title of Simon sermon is entitled, “Weaving and Unweaving - The Return” based on Isaiah 43:18-21. You may possibly remember that when Simon preached here for the first time, he preached on Isaiah 42:8-9 and, as part of this talk, he gave a prophetic word about weaving and unweaving. In that talk Simon talked about the need to unpick or unweave certain things, so that new things can replace them as we are directed by God. Today, Simon feels led to return to this idea and feels that this approach will be necessary when we come out of the present restrictions. Today’s service will also include communion. Derek

We do need to know by Monday evening of any changes. This might mean that we cannot accommodate everyone who wants to come every week and we may have to use a rota system. When on the church property (and that includes the car park), you must observe social distancing and wear a mask within the church boundaries at all times. Some of you haven’t yet put your choice in writing and so, if that is you, can you do so as soon as possible. If you are unsure as to how this will work and how it affects you, please give me a ring.
