UPDATE ON BARNABAS FUND – As you know, Barnabas Fund is one For those of you who are unsure what the Barnabas Fund is used for, I have summarised some of their activities here. Feeds starving children in places such as in Zimbabwe and Egypt.

- Trains people in a trade and helps them in setting up a business such as tailoring or vending of snacks.
- Frees Pakistani brick-kiln worker families from their debt.
- Helps those who survive the many slaughtering raids on Christians in Nigeria.
- Sends emergency aid to areas such as Beirut, Lebanon after the massive sodium nitrate storage explosion.

BARNABAS TODAY - Launched in September 2020, Barnabas Fund’s new ‘Barnabas Today’ website prioritizes resources created by Christians living under persecution and poverty, to encourage other believers facing pressure and difficulties There are hymns and songs in different languages, Bible studies, sermons and devotional material, ‘to bless us all wherever we live’.
