GETTING READY FOR CHRISTMAS – After your magnificent effort for the Harvest collection, we are organising a collection of items again before Christmas – for Foodbank and St. Joseph's night shelter.

They have informed us that they would like to receive:

- Mince pies; Christmas puddings
- Biscuits; Ready-made custard (tinned or carton);
- Stuffing; Gravy granules;
- Tinned vegetables (but not baked beans!);
- Chocolates including children's selections;
- Toiletries e.g. shampoo, shower gel, soaps;
- St. Joseph's are also grateful for any non-perishable foodstuffs but especially the above at this time of year.

Assuming that the church is allowed to re-open in early December, Brenda is organising a drop off point on Saturday 5th December for bringing to Church between 10 am to 1 pm — subject to lockdown restrictions.
