LIVING IN TIER 2 - As you all must all know by now from Wednesday 2nd December we will be living under a new set of restrictions for the next few weeks. Although we haven't had any official notifications on how this will affect the church, we will be re-opening for worship next Sunday. We will be following the same procedure as before. You may recall that previously told me whether you want to continue to worship home (Status - HOME) or whether you want to attend the live service (Status – CHURCH). You are free to change your mind at any time by letting me know in writing as we have to keep detailed records of who attends for "Track and Trace" purposes. We do need to know by Monday evening of any changes. This might mean that we cannot accommodate everyone who wants to come every week and we may have to use a rota system. When on the church property (and that includes the car park), you must observe social distancing and wear a mask within the church boundaries at all times.
