This weekend we will be worshipping both in church and online. As you are aware, due to social distancing recommendations, numbers in church are restricted to 35. This week, Simon continues with our series on "Signs of Jesus' return" with today's sermon being entitled, "Signs of Jesus' return IV – Like Lightning." Simon's talk is based on Matthew 24:23-35. In this passage, Jesus talks to His disciples about His return and promises a time will come when "the sign of the Son of Man will appear in the sky, and all mourn. They will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of the sky, with power and great glory." At this time unbelievers will mourn because they suddenly realise they have chosen the wrong side. Clive will be leading our midweek service as we continue with our series based on Psalm 119:169-176. The title of his sermon is, "God's word – Overflowing". It was Jesus' desire that His followers should live out their lives in line with the truth of God's word in a world of lies and somehow remain sanctified (or separated) from the world's bad influence. The Psalmist begins this section in verse 169 by crying out to the LORD – Jehovah: "May my cry come before you, LORD; give understanding according to your word. May my supplication come before you; deliver me according to your promise." Notice he is crying out in desperation. Don't miss out on this important series just because it goes out midweek.
