This weekend we will be worshipping both in church and online. This week, Simon begins our New Year with his talk entitled, "Past, present and future – time to trust" based on Revelation 1:7-8. Twelve months ago, the archbishop of Canterbury urged people to make personal connections with others in 2020 to create a new unity in a divided society. In his new year message, Justin Welby said: "Let's go for a heroic new year's resolution. Let's resolve to reconnect. To reach out to just one person we don't know, or from whom we have drifted apart. "Pick one person. Pick up the phone. Send them a text. Meet them for a cup of tea. Make that connection. Let's begin cementing our unity one brick at a time." How appropriate that message seems in retrospect for what followed as we struggled to cope with various forms of lockdown. NEW MIDWEEK SERIES – The "I will" statements of Jesus – When we are asked to do something and we say, "I will do it later", we generally mean it isn't that important to us at that moment. We might well intend to "do it later" but we may just as easily mean that I have no intention of doing it. It's just a way of buying us time. In contrast, when Jesus says, "I will do …"., He really means it. It means He is able and willing to do it. There is no evidence in Scripture of Jesus saying that He will do something and then not doing it. Consequently the "I will" statements of Jesus are really important in our understanding of what is to come. Over the next seven weeks we will be looking at:

- 6th January The "I will" of Salvation John 6:37
- 13th January The "I will" of cleansing Luk5 5:13
- 20th January The "I will" of confession Matthew 10:32
- 27th January The "I will" of service Mark 1:17
- 3rd February The "I will" of comfort John 14:18
- 10th February The "I will" of Resurrection John 6:40
- 17th February -The "I will" of Glory John 17:26
