ABC ONLINE – TWICE A WEEK – EVERY WEEK

Consequently, our services will now only be available online. This week, Simon will be preaching from Exodus 17:1-7 and the title of his message is Water in the desert. We know that even in our current desert experience that this lockdown has created, Jesus says to us "... whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." Don't you just want some of this water today? Derek.

This week we continue with our midweek series on the “I will” statements of Jesus. When we are asked to do something and we say, “I will do it later”, we generally mean it isn’t that important to us at that moment. We might well intend to “do it later” but we may just as easily mean that I have no intention of doing it. It’s just a way of buying us time. In contrast, when Jesus says, “I will do ...”, He really means it. It means He is able and willing to do it. There is no evidence in Scripture of Jesus saying that He will do something and then not doing it. Consequently the “I will” statements of Jesus are really important in our understanding of what is to come.

This week Clive will be looking at the “I will” of cleansing based on Luke 5:13. This can be accessed using the same link from 4pm on Tuesday.
