In our midweek series this week we will be continuing with our series on the "I will" statements of Jesus. This week, Simon will be preaching on the "I will of confession" based on Matthew 10:32 where Jesus says, "Whoever acknowledges me before men, I will also acknowledge him before my Father in heaven." Jesus challenges each one of us to openly live for Him. There can be no such thing as a "hidden" Christian. The way we live our lives should supply enough evidence that can be seen by the world – to show that we are indeed Christians. This is a really important reminder to us all so do make sure you join in with our midweek worship service. We must always remember that when Jesus says, "I will do ...", He really means it. He means He is able and willing to do it. There is no evidence in Scripture of Jesus saying that He will do something and then not doing it. Consequently the "I will" statements of Jesus are really important in our understanding of what is to come.
