There will be more room there and paved work outside for Tony to move around in his wheelchair. Please pray that Tony accepts this move as he wasn't initially keen on the idea.

AN UPDATE FROM SAMARA - Our three areas of focus to support the Syrian people are Food, Health and Education. We need to take ownership of the growing and production process as much as possible, even if just for a narrow group of important foods. (In the utterly broken economy of Syria, widowed mothers have been forced to make many degrading decisions for themselves and for their children, just to eat and survive. UNICEF stated in a report this month that between November 2019 - November 2020, there has been a 251% increase in the prices of the food.) Please pray that we can make inroads into this urgent problem.

URGENT PRAYER REQUESTS - We have just heard that **Janice Sprules** went to the hospital for a cardiac check-up yesterday and that the doctors found a clot in her heart. The doctors need to check with the consultant on Monday as to the next step. Please pray for Janice's peace of mind, for the correct treatment as soon as possible and for healing. Please pray too for **Ann Tyler** who was moved from St.Richards to Avisford Park Hotel yesterday as they have certain rooms set aside, with carers, for patients but unfortunately Ann had a bad turn and is now back in the emergency ward at St.Richards. Pray for correct diagnosis and for a satisfactory plan for her ongoing care.
