ABC ONLINE – TWICE A WEEK – EVERY WEEK

Following the Government's current guidelines and the subsequent advice from the Baptist Union, the church is now **open** for Sunday worship. We do, however, still need to follow the current restrictions which means, social distancing, masks, sanitiser, no singing and restricted numbers. We are restricted to 35 worshippers (more details inside). As numbers are restricted, we will be continuing with our online services on Sundays and Wednesdays. This Sunday, Simon will be bringing the message, based on Exodus 15:22-27, with his talk on "Names of God V — Yahweh Rapha". This is the fifth in Simon's mini-series on how God is portrayed in our Bibles. Our Sunday morning service will go "live" at 6pm on a Saturday evening. However, if possible, we would like you to join us on Sunday in prayer at around 10.20am before watching the service at 10.30am as normal.

In our midweek series this week we continue with our new 13 part series entitled, "Unstoppable – A journey through the Book of Acts". In this series we will be considering God's plans for His church and asking, "Why do we do what we do?" and "Is this what God wants us to do?"

This week Derek will be bringing us part 3 as we take a look at "The threat of sin within" based on Acts 4:32-37, 5:1-11. This is quite a quite a difficult passage which has serious implications for all of us in our walk with God.

THE CHURCH IS NOW OPEN FOR SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP - We are now open for Sunday morning worship but still under the current restrictions which means, social distancing, masks, sanitiser, no singing and restricted numbers. Current covid restrictions are still in force although the number of cases in this area is falling. The church remains closed for all other activities. We are monitoring the both the Government's and the Baptist Union's guidance as to when this may change. We just ask that you remain patient and vigilant for the time being. Derek.
