ABC ONLINE - TWICE A WEEK - EVERY WEEK

Following the Government's current guidelines and the subsequent advice from the Baptist Union, the church is now **open** for Sunday worship. We do, however, still need to follow the current restrictions which means, social distancing, masks, sanitiser, no singing and restricted numbers. We are restricted to around 35 worshippers – so you need to book a seat. As numbers are restricted, we will be continuing with our online services on Sundays and Wednesdays. This Sunday, Simon returns to our series based on the "Names of God" reach part 8 – "Yahweh Sabaoth." In this series Simon has been intentionally linking the names of God to the character of God – something perhaps take that we don't think about too often as we only see things from our point of view.
