ABC ONLINE – TWICE A WEEK – EVERY WEEK

Following the Government's current guidelines and the subsequent advice from the Baptist Union, the church remains **open** for Sunday worship. We do, however, still need to follow the current restrictions which means, social distancing, masks, sanitiser, no singing and restricted numbers. We are restricted to around 35 worshippers – so you need to book a seat. As numbers are restricted, we will be continuing with our online services on Sundays and Wednesdays. This weekend, Simon returns to our series based on the "Prayer". The title of Simon's talk is "Prayer IV - How great thou art" based around Psalm 148. – In this series Simon is reminding us of the importance and the privilege of prayer. As we drove into the hospital, I could hear a loud cheer coming from their car. I then waved to them and drove away thinking what a wonderful feeling it is, when you find the way after being lost.
