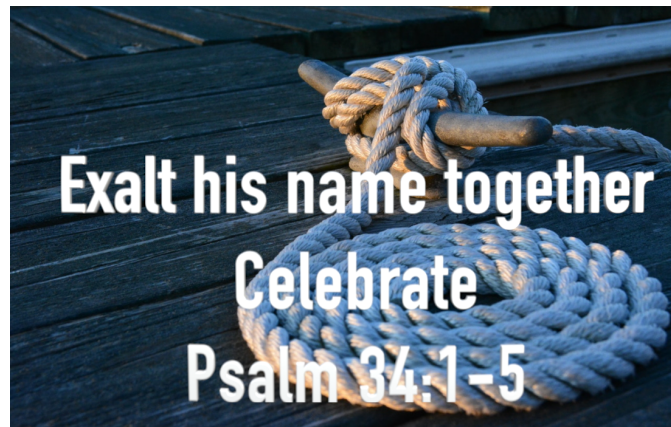

UPDATE ON POLLY BENNETT - Polly begins her monthly treatment for NHL on Monday 2nd August until Christmas Eve. We have taken advice from the hospital and the following has been suggested. She would like to continue coming to church and meeting people during this time but it is important that the church family understand that if they are unwell they should get nowhere near her as her antibodies to resist COVID or any other disease will be compromised. As long as there is no physical contact, people maintain a social distance and use hand sanitiser she will be able to attend church (although seated away from the main congregation) and still have visitors as long as she feels up to it and the visitors are themselves not unwell and prepared to maintain social distance. Because I live with Polly, I am subject to the same regime, BUT please don't stay completely away from us and please do not think that we are being unfriendly. It is just a temporary arrangement and we would be grateful if you could pray for a successful treatment and that after Christmas we may see an end to this difficult regime. Clive
