# **ABC ONLINE – TWICE A WEEK – EVERY WEEK**

Following the Government's current guidelines and the subsequent advice from the Baptist Union, the church remains **open** for Sunday worship. We do, however, still need to follow the current restrictions which means, social distancing, masks, sanitiser, no singing and restricted numbers. We are restricted to around 35 worshippers – so you need to book a seat. As numbers are restricted, we will be continuing with our online services on Sundays and Wednesdays. This weekend, Simon returns to our series based on the "Names of God". The title of Simon's talk is "Names of God IX - Abba" based around Romans 8:12-16. – In this series Simon has been intentionally linking the names of God to the character of God – something perhaps take that we don't think about too often as we tend to see things from our point of view. In our midweek series this week we will be continuing with our 13 part series entitled, "Unstoppable – A journey through the Book of Acts". In this series we will be considering God's plans for His church and asking, "Why do we do what we do?" and "Is this what God really wants us to do?" This week Clive will be bringing us part 12 entitled, "Leaders Lead". This week's message comes from Acts chapter 20:17-38 and so you may find it helpful to read through this chapter before the service. You should find this talk very relevant to us today as there is little doubt that all churches need leaders who lead. Historically, however, churches often go off track because of strong, leadership. Yes, leaders need must lead but their ideas need to be inspired by the Holy Spirit through spending time with the Lord rather than their own intellect.
