Sunday 18th July 2021 THINGS ARE CHANGING ...

Following the Government's current guidelines and the subsequent advice from the Baptist Union, the church will be fully open for worship from 25th July. The chairs will be arranged slightly differently to enable people to sit together or sit alone as they choose. Masks will be optional and we urge you to make your own decision about this. There will be no refreshments on 25th but these will return 1st August although served in the hall. This, of course, is subject to any changes that might occur in the meantime.

This weekend, Simon continues with our series on "Prayer". The title of Simon's talk is "Prayer VI – Our father who art ..." based the Lord's teaching to his disciples as recorded in Matthew 6:9-13. In this series Simon is reminding us of the importance and the privilege of prayer. Sometimes we forget that prayer takes into the very throne room of God and should be taken very seriously indeed.
