LATEST BAPTIST UNION GUIDELINES

As you probably know by now, the Government has moved to its Covid19 – Plan B. In this guidance the Government, has advised churches that face coverings much be worn in places of worship from 10th December, for those not exempt. Although the government also say that “there is a reasonable excuse exemption which allows people to remove a face covering while singing”, we disagree with this exemption and **would ask you to wear masks throughout the service.**
