HOME MISSION – A MESSAGE FROM PAUL KERLEY (SEBA's regional minister)
I am writing to thank your church for supporting Baptist Home Mission in 2021. Sometimes churches say to me "Why should we support Home Mission?" For me Home Mission is all about helping Baptist Union churches and projects reach their mission potential and bring the love of God to their communities. In fact all Baptist churches around the country are encouraged to prayerfully and financially support Home Mission and in this way every member of the Baptist family can support, encourage and resource one another. In fact, it is true to say that "Every Baptist church is a Home Mission church". Why? Because every Baptist church that supports Home Mission can benefit from the Baptist Union National Resource Teams at Didcot and the work and ministry of SEBA – especially the work of our Regional Ministers and staff. Then of course there are those churches in SEBA that need some financial assistance from Home Mission in order to facilitate paid ministry. In 2022 there are 10 SEBA churches and projects that are receiving Home Mission Grants (now called Church Growth Grants) to allow them to have a part or full time minister. These are... Hawkinge Baptist, Arabic Community Church, Community Church Robertsbridge, Good News Brighton, Addlestone Baptist, Chiddingfold Baptist, Hawkhurst Baptist, Newhaven Baptist, Kent Thameside and Northfleet North. May the Lord richly bless you and the work of your church this year.
