He seems to be ok (and was making eyes at the nurses!), but will need a further scan to make sure all is well. The current plan is that he stays there for a few more days, and is then discharged straight back to his home in Worthing. This would avoid a transfer to Worthing Hospital and distressing him further. Thank you to everyone for their prayers and messages of support.
