NEWS FROM MAF - MAF is alerting people to the growing humanitarian crisis in South Sudan as thousands of refugees enter South Sudan through the border town of Renk—after a gruelling two-day journey, numbers swelling to over 100,000 as they flee to safety from fighting that erupted in Sudan. Improvised shelters are constructed to protect people from the harsh sun, and at night they sleep on the bare ground, often without blankets.

MAF's Disaster Response team has been conducting survey flights and assessments to plan for an air bridge to support aid workers and bring in relief supplies to reach displaced people. The MAF South Sudan program will supply aircraft and staffing for the air bridge.

Let us pray for the people in Sudan and South Sudan, and support the MAF team and others who are working hard to relieve the suffering. Barbara.
