James 2:14 - 26

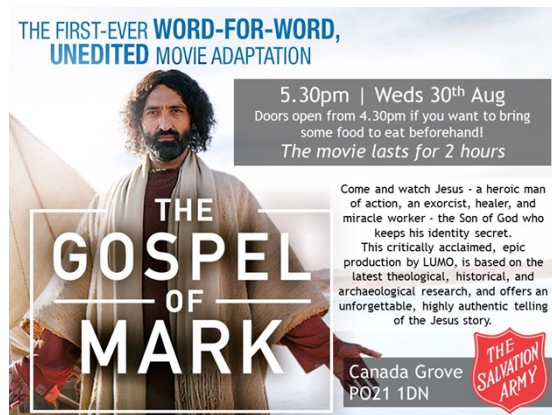
