A MESSAGE FROM SIMON - Some of you may remember that back in November I said that I believe the Lord has given me some very important and specific sermons to do in the new year, and so here they are. I would, therefore, be grateful if you can read the passages for these talks in advance. I would also be grateful if you can be praying specifically for me, because the one on the 14th, particularly, is a big talk for me to do. May I encourage you to come along to these talks because I believe God has given these to us, at the start of this new year, for a reason.

January 7th (Today – Family Service) - Eyes wide open I: this is the way, walk ye in it (family service) - Isaiah 30v21. In this service Simon will be sharing the reasons behind his choice of this year's memory verse which is taken from Isaiah 30:21.
