"The Kingdom of Heaven: Small Beginnings, Great Impact"

Matthew 13:31-35

THIS WEEKEND'S WORSHIP SERVICE – Clive's band will be leading worship at our monthly family service. Today we will be continuing to look at the parables of Jesus as recorded in Matthew 13. The theme of today's service is "The Kingdom of Heaven: Small Beginnings, Great Impact" and our reading comes from Matthew 13:31-35. In this reading Jesus' illustrates two profound truths about the kingdom of God. On a global scale, the kingdom of God started small—Jesus and His few disciples—but it has grown to encompass believers around the world. The growth of God's kingdom in Aldwick may seem slow at times, but it is powerful and inevitable. Today's service should encourage to share the Gospel with at least one other person, for how else will the Gospel will spread, if we remain silent?
