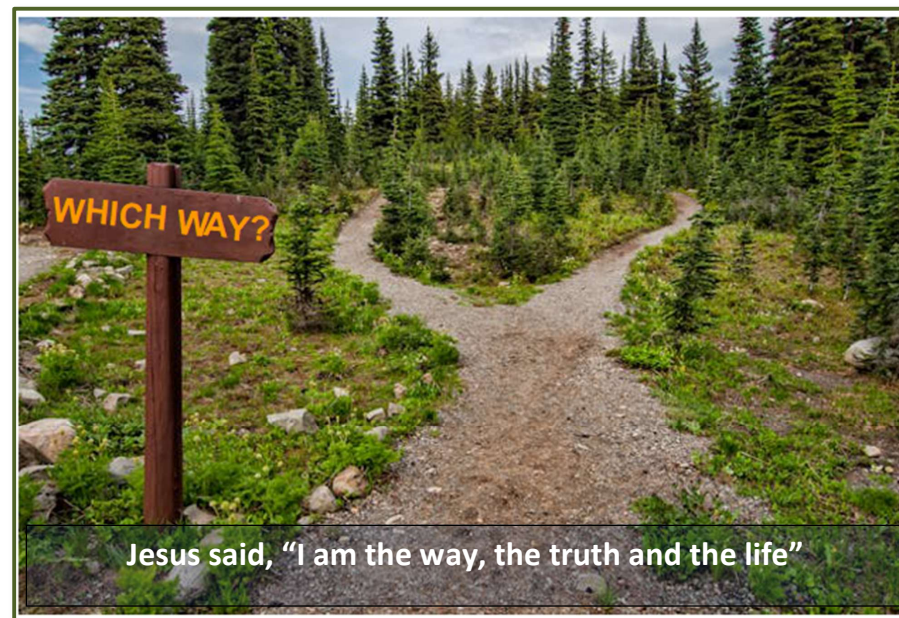

WEC CAMPS 2025 – This weekend the WEC Christian holiday camps welcome their second groups of young people to the camps at Criccieth in North Wales. The good news is that the camps were fully booked for both weeks which means around 400 young people will be celebrating a week of inspiring worship, solid Bible teaching and engaging mission sessions. These sessions are aimed at exactly the right level for the young people on camp and don't simply stop at the end of the meetings. Discussions and exploration of the themes carries on throughout the week and are often picked up in the evening quiet times. Of course, there is also lots of lovely food cooked on the field kitchen and plenty of fun. As the camps are held under canvas, please do pray for good weather and not too much wind. Pray too for the leaders and the young people that together they will grow in their faith as well as enjoying themselves.
