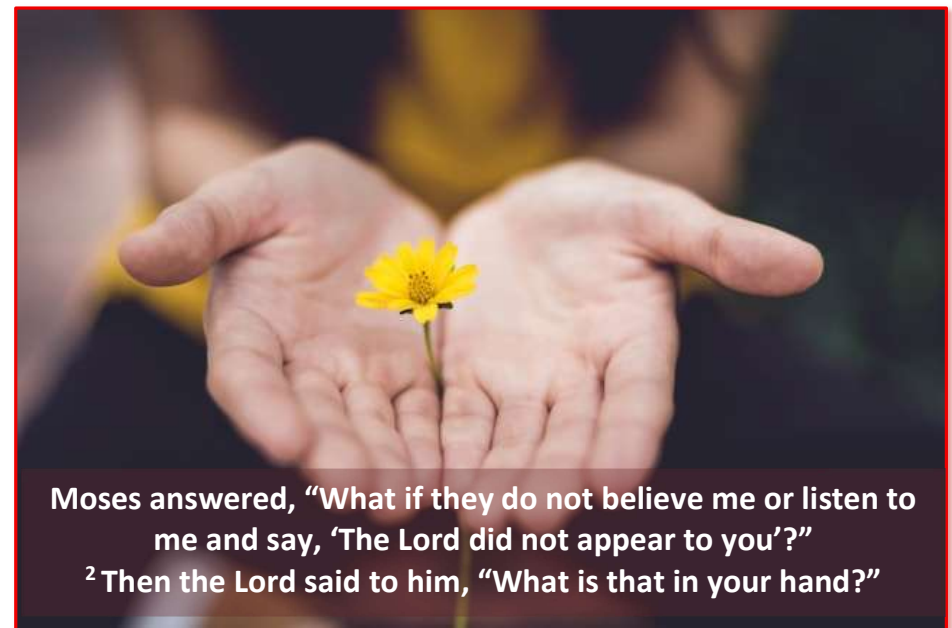
Please pray too for Matt Woods as he is back in hospital. Pray for healing. Pray too for Cilla and the family as they are all worried about Matt.
