

REMEMBERING A GREAT MAN - C. T. Studd was once a famous cricketer in England, playing for the national team at the height of his sporting career. But after coming to faith in Jesus Christ, he gave up fame, fortune, and comfort to become a missionary — first in China, then India, and finally in Africa.

When people questioned his decision to leave behind everything, he famously replied:

"If Jesus Christ be God and died for me, then no sacrifice can be too great for me to make for Him."

Studd didn't just speak about faith—he lived it, wholeheartedly. We should be doing the same!

Sometimes life takes us on unexpected paths — roads we wouldn't have chosen, detours we never planned. Yet, along the way, God is guiding us. This poem reflects on such a journey and the surprising realisation that Jesus has been walking with us all along — our way, our truth, and our life.
