

This Sunday, we reflect on God's question to the prophet Ezekiel: 'Can these bones live?' It's a question that still echoes in our hearts when we face dry seasons, broken hopes, or spiritual fatigue. The poem below was written to encourage you—whatever valley you may be in—to remember that God is still in the business of restoration.

When the Valley Feels Too Quiet
