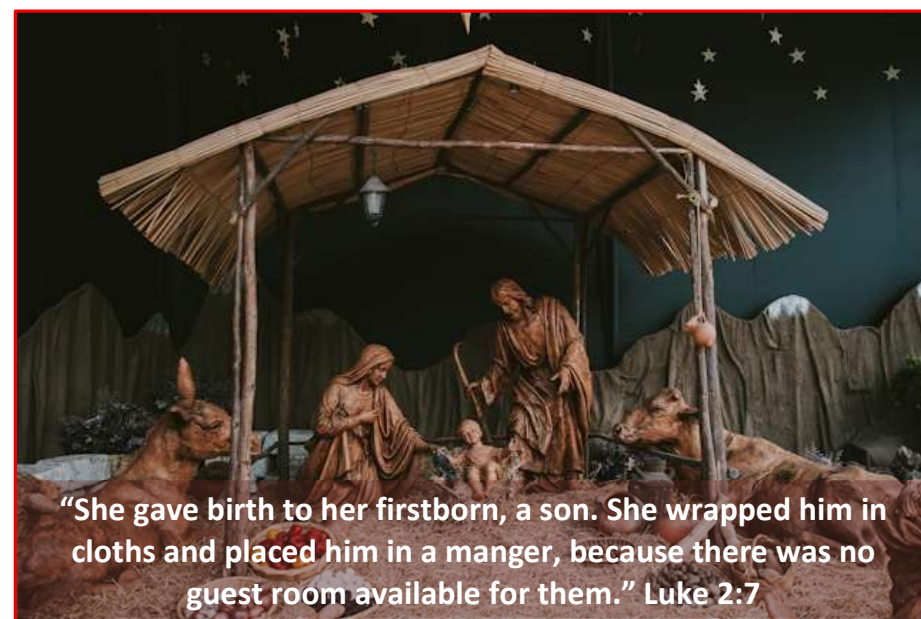
Pray too for healing for Jon and Michelle who are both unwell.
