In Mark's Gospel, the baptism of Jesus marks a breathtaking moment: **heaven opened**. But what does that mean for us here and now?

While we wait for the fullness of heaven, God gives us glimpses — in the beauty of creation, in the love of family and friends, and in the gentle presence of His Spirit. This poem invites us to imagine what heaven must be like... and to recognise the quiet ways it breaks through even now.

Heaven Opened

Can you imagine heaven's light,
Where sorrow fades and all is right?
A place where joy flows full and free,
And all is as it's meant to be?

And yet, down here, we catch a trace —
In ocean breeze, in mountain grace.
In laughter shared and meals made sweet,

At Jordan's shore, the sky once tore,
