Please pray for:

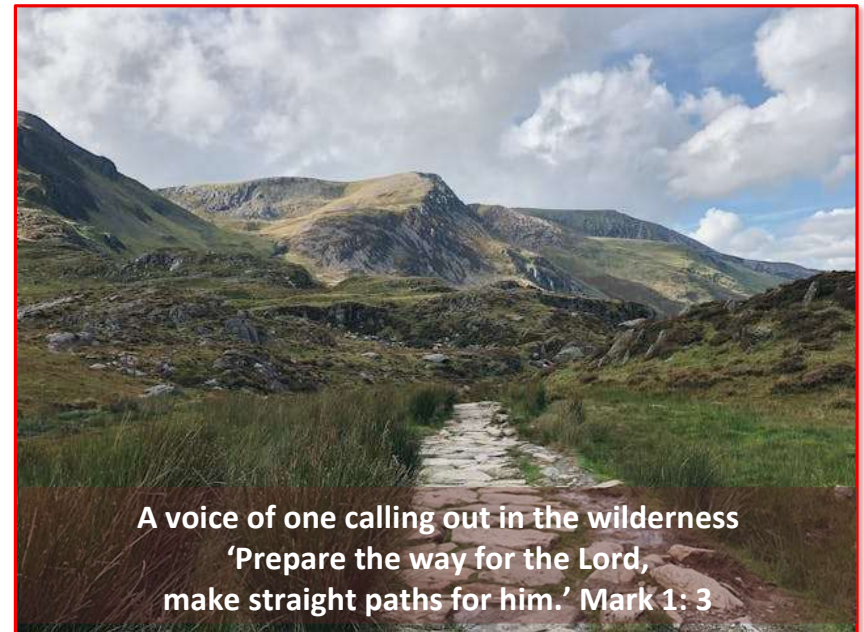
- Frank Yorkston who is still in a lot of pain from his right hip - this means Frank is really struggling at present. Please pray for urgent action by the medical staff and healing.

As you may already know I (Rio) am doing an 'immersive placement' with Aldwick Baptist Church. I am doing research to find out how people in the congregation of Aldwick Baptist Church view homegroups and pastoral care in this setting in order to be able to feed back to the leadership team and suggest ways of improving this provision if necessary.

My research will have 3 parts which will run simultaneously:

Part 1: Questionnaires

There are some questionnaires at the back of the church. I would be grateful if as many of you as possible could fill one in and pop it in the questionnaire box by the end of the day on Wednesday 4th February 2026.

Part 2: Interviews

I am looking to interview a variety of people over the next few weeks, up until Friday 6th February. This is an opportunity to share in more depth about your experiences and views of pastoral care and homegroups. I would like to interview a range of people, both those in homegroups and those not in homegroups, and people from a variety of backgrounds and experiences.
