Dear Ambassadors

“Lord...are you not the God who is in heaven? You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. Power and might are in your hand, and no one can withstand you.” 2 Chronicles 20:6

I hope you are well and enjoyed a good start to the year.

Ahead of my Ambassador newsletter I wanted to share an update on the situation in Iran and SAT-7's response. I have attached a document and slides with prayer points that can be shared with your church or friends. Please do join us in praying for the people of Iran at this time of uncertainty and turmoil following the violence caused by protests against the regime.

As you will be aware, it is reported that thousands of Iranians have been killed over the last week as many took to the streets across the country. As well as obscuring the true number of casualties, the government's internet shutdown has made it almost impossible for families to communicate with each other as well as viewers contacting SAT-7. This also impacts many of our SAT-7 PARS staff who have family and friends inside the country.

In the face of these challenges, SAT-7 teams have responded quickly to the crisis and today a special programme called *Freedom and Hope* on our Persian channel (SAT-7 PARS) will explore the role of Christians in this situation and offer counselling. Other topical weekly shows, such as *Insiders* which is filmed in our London studio, are helping viewers to navigate different practical and spiritual issues relating to the current situation e.g. an episode last week examined the role of media in shaping narratives and advised viewers how they can examine different news sources for truth and reliability.

Please do encourage your church or prayer group to pray into this ongoing situation. Do also thank those whose prayer and support are enabling SAT-7 to share hope in these very difficult circumstances.

AFRICAN ADVENTURES UPDATE

Dear Simon,

Following your feedback requesting more updates on donations, we wanted to take a moment to extend our heartfelt thanks for your continued generosity. Here is an update on how your donation was used and the impact it has made.

Your donation of £500 in February 2025 and regular gifts from your church has helped sustain our Food Security Programme across five partner schools in Nakuru, one of Kenya's most disadvantaged urban communities and the impact of your ongoing support is truly felt every day.

Because of your Church's support, children who might otherwise arrive at school hungry are instead welcomed with two nutritious meals each school day. This simple but powerful support helps children stay healthy, concentrate in class, and attend school more regularly. For families facing extreme food insecurity, it also brings reassurance and relief, knowing their children are being cared for.

Over the course of 2025, the programme supported 1,280 children across our partner schools.

Thanks to supporters like you:

- Around 25,600 meals were provided each month
- Teachers reported clear improvements in attendance, focus, and engagement
- Families felt less pressure knowing their children were fed during the school day

Hear from a teacher at one of our partner schools: *“I have been teaching in this school for several years and used to wonder why the students were not curious when we are doing science experiments or asking questions with eagerness. Then I realized that this would happen mostly when they had not gotten breakfast from home and were not anticipating to get lunch either. It dawned to me that I would also not care about how plants are growing if I don't know where I will get my next meal. Now that the feeding program is here my students are more eager and curious to learn. They are always asking me questions because they don't have to worry about what they will eat for breakfast or lunch. I wish you would get a glimpse of the chats when queueing for lunch it's what every teacher would wish for her students. I wake up very motivated to come and teach because I am meeting happy faces. To our donors in UK, we are very grateful for the opportunity to have our children fed. They have never gone without getting food.”*

Thank you again for supporting us and for caring so deeply about these children and their futures. Please know how grateful we are for your continued support.
