Please also hold Heather and Andrew Gaudoin in prayer as they come to terms with the loss of their brother Andre's.

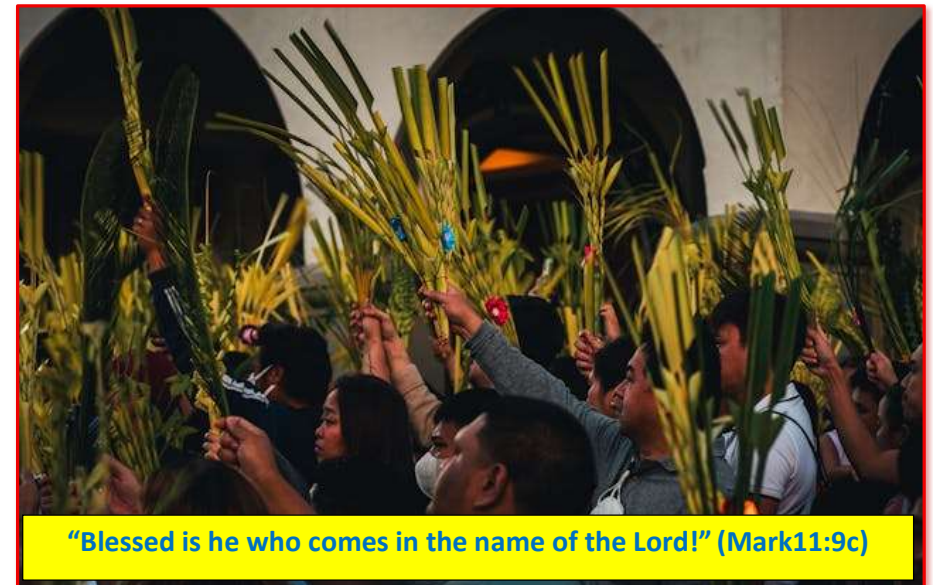
