A BIG QUESTION? Have you ever wondered how a Baptist church works? Here are the answers to four questions people often ask about life at ABC.

1. How is the church financed?

ABC is largely funded by the faithful giving of its members and congregation. We receive no regular funding from the government or the Baptist Union. Through God's provision and the generosity of His people, we can continue our worship, ministry and mission.

2. Why should I become a member of ABC?

Membership is a way of saying, "This is my church family, and I want to play my part." It is a commitment to worship, prayer, fellowship, service and mission. As Baptists, we believe that church members should seek God's will together and share responsibility for the life and future of the church.

3. What is the Church Meeting?

The Church Meeting is where church members gather to pray, listen to God, share important information and make decisions together. In Baptist churches, it is the principal decision-making body of the church and an opportunity for every member's voice to be heard.

4. What is the Diaconate? The Diaconate is a team of church members elected by the church to work alongside the minister(s) in providing spiritual leadership, pastoral oversight and practical support. Their role is to help the church flourish and to enable its mission and ministry to thrive.
