IAN SURRELL –Ian has been discharged from hospital and is now at home, but he still needs our prayers. Please pray for healing and peace of mind.

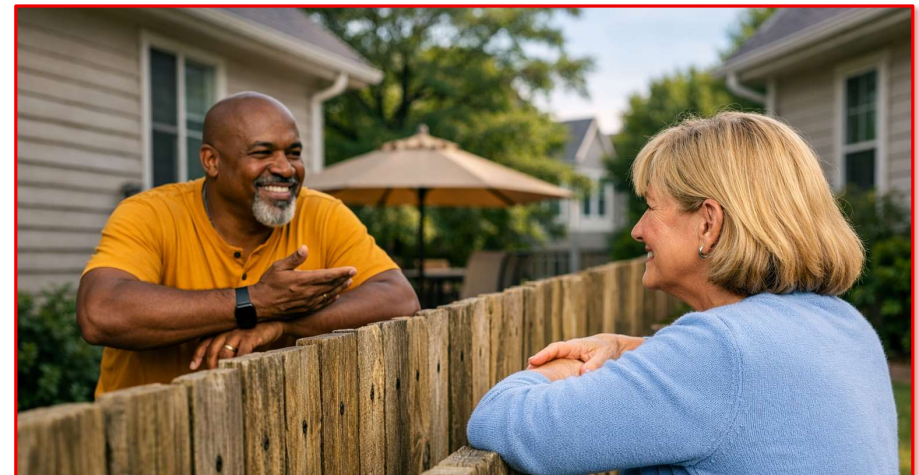
